Achieved a second Gold rating on the Sustainability Tracking, Assessment & Rating System (STARS), a transparent, self-reporting framework for colleges and universities to measure their sustainability performance.



UW Bothell received the 2017 Sustainability Award in Facilities Management from the professional organization for educational facilities managers, APPA.



UW Tacoma offers one of the nation's first bachelor's degrees in Sustainable Urban Development, and has many other programs for students interested in sustainability, including Environmental Science, Sustainable Urban Development, and the Milgard School of Business's Center for Leadership and Social Responsibility.



The new West Campus Utility Plant (WCUP) received an Envision Gold award from the Institute for Sustainable Infrastructure (ISI), the first certified Envision Gold building to be certified at any college or university.



Featured by the Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education (AASHE) as a top performer in the 2016 Sustainable Campus Index. The UW was recognized as a top-5 university in the categories of transportation and food & dining, as well as a featured highlight for investment practices.



The UW's Livable City Year program, launched in 2016 with UW Sustainability as a collaborative partner, connects UW faculty and students from all three campuses with a local community for a full academic year to work on projects relating to the community's goals around livability and sustainability. UW Medicine is recognized as a sustainability leader in healthcare. Two UW Medicine hospitals, UW Medical Center and Harborview Medical Center, are regularly honored with Practice GreenHealth's Top 25 Environmental Excellence Award, recognizing the 25 health care facilities across the county that best exemplify environmental excellence.

UW SUSTAINABILITY

UW Sustainability supports the Environmental Stewardship Committee (ESC), facilitates implementation strategies for the Climate Action Plan (CAP) and oversees the student-led Campus Sustainability Fund (CSF). As a learning laboratory, we coordinate behavior change programs that help reduce UW's environmental footprint and expenses, such as Green Certifications for offices and laboratories, paper reduction and green team support. We coordinate institutional data for the UW Sustainability Dashboard and external reporting agencies and track performance on campus sustainability.

Our office works to help the UW maintain its national leadership position in campus sustainability by coordinating responses to awards and reports. Our engagement programs include organizing the annual SustainableUW Festival and mentoring students in event management with the campus-wide Earth Day celebration. This year, UW Sustainability was a collaborating partner for the UW Livable City Year program (LCY.uw.edu) and hosted freshman seminars with First Year Programs to encourage sustainability practices.






CLIMATE ACTION PLAN (CAP)


The University of Washington is a charter signatory to the American College & University Presidents' Climate Commitment (ACUPCC), and is committed to developing an institutional action plan to become climate neutral. In January 2009, under the auspices of the Environmental Stewardship Advisory Committee, a Climate Action Planning Oversight Team formed to create a Climate Action Plan, which describes preliminary strategies UW will explore, including our intent to work toward climate-neutrality.

The UW is working towards meeting the first emissions goal, a 15% reduction from 2005 levels, by 2020. Recently, student research teams created a more accurate method of calculating emissions for travel taken on behalf of UW, as well as recommendations for ways to cut those emissions.

ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE (ESC)

The UW Environmental Stewardship Committee provides recommendations for University policies and oversees progress towards meeting the goals of the UW Climate Action Plan. In 2016-2017, the ESC members identified a number of priority items and formed working groups to address them, including development of Green Building standards, Greening Health Sciences at UW, strategic communications for the ESC, and identifying key performance indicators.



INSPIRING CHANGE REDUCING OUR FOOTPRINT

UW Sustainability's Green Certification programs reduce the environmental impact of various spaces across campus by educating students, faculty and staff about sustainable practices, providing resources and recognition to offices and labs. GREEN OFFICE

The Green Office Certification program has promoted sustainable practices in workspaces at UW since 2011. All staff, faculty and students at UW can initiate the office certification process. green.uw.edu/green-office



GREEN LAB

The Green Laboratory Certification Program recognizes laboratories at UW that operate and behave sustainably within their laboratory space. Using roughly four times more energy than office spaces of the same size, laboratories have an enormous impact on a university's energy use. green.uw.edu/greenlab

GREEN RSO

UW Sustainability is piloting a Registered Student Organization (RSO) green certification, launching in Fall 2017, to encourage student organizations to adopt green practices.



PAPER REDUCTION

The Paper Reduction Program works to reduce paper consumption and save money across the University of Washington. The UW is committed to reduce the amount of paper used, while also utilizing 100% recycled paper when printing is necessary.

Paper Reduction Pros is a program that gives recognition to those who make significant and conscious efforts to considerably reduce the amount of paper they use, as well as people who educate their peers in paper reduction.





Exploring Sustainability Seminar Series

UW Sustainability offers a quarterly undergraduate seminar series through First Year Programs that gives students the opportunity to explore sustainability at UW and beyond. Each quarter focuses on a different topic, including sustainability resources, sustainability-related academic programs and degrees, and how students can make more sustainable choices in their personal and professional lives.

CAMPUS SUSTAINABILITY FUND

The **Campus Sustainability Fund (CSF)** provides grants for students to create on-campus sustainability projects. The CSF is student-funded and student-run, with all grant decisions made by the student CSF committee. Students can apply for a large grant during two funding rounds each year in the Fall and Spring, or apply anytime for small grants of less than \$1,000. UW & SEATTLE CITY LIGHT


